Film Synopsis

Steve Rogers (Chris Evans) is a scrawny young lad who is desperate to join the US Armed Forces and fight for his country in the Second World War, but whose list of health issues keeps getting him rejected.

As he tries to enlist in yet another city under a false name, he is spotted by Dr. Erskine (Stanley Tucci) who's taken with his determination. Erskine recruits Rogers for a secret Super Soldier programme, in which the government intends to inject recruits with a revolutionary cell-enhancing serum to create an army with higher efficiency, and so win the war.

The challenges that follow for Steve come from people's disbelief in his abilities and they portray him as a novelty. This forces Captain America to take things into his own hands and prove to the world that he is more than a side-show act. *Synopsis written by Adrian Drayton*

Steve Rogers was not what anyone expected when people were thinking of the future hero, Captain America. He was humble and did not have the physical presence of most of the other soldiers. Yet, he had something that made him stand out.

There is a margin for error in judgement if people are evaluated solely on the basis of their appearance. What sort of qualities might we overlook in others in our hurry to pigeon-hole people into categories defined by society?

He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. - Isaiah 53:2
